Hereford Cathedral Librarian Jennifer Dumbleton will introduce the Hereford Mappa Mundi, a medieval map which includes Bangor as one of only 5 Irish cities represented. She'll also talk about the chained library at Hereford Cathedral; the collection dates back to 800 AD and includes some marvelous illuminated manuscripts and early printed works. Along the way she'll be discussing the production of manuscripts, why collections like the chained library matter and some unexpected links between Hereford Cathedral and Bangor Abbey.
