List of Directions for attending Mass in line with the Government Guidelines.

1. Enter through the main doors of the Church only.
2. Exit through the doors at the Baptismal Font only. If you are unable to use the steps please wait in your seat until the majority of people have left and the Stewards will direct you out.
3. There will be hand-sanitisers on entering the Church in the foyer and the steward will confirm your seat number and direct you to your seat(s). Families / households are seated together – (2 metre rule) please respect social distancing as you enter the Church. There will be a time for prayer after Mass so reverence on exiting will permit personal silent prayer.
4. Confession will be offered after all Masses.
5. Envelope collections or donations can be given to one of the stewards when entering or leaving.
6. A mask must be worn at all times within the Church.
7. Distribution of Holy Communion will be given directly to you at your seat. You will receive Holy Communion on the hand only. The host will be placed on your hands. The Priest will sanitise his hands before distribution of Holy Communion and will wear a face mask.
8. When Mass is over please remain in your seats until the Stewards direct you to leave one row at a time. Please keep 2 metres distance as you leave the Church and please move quickly once outside to the carpark to allow others to safely exit the Church.
9. The parish secretary will be in the parish office from Monday to Friday 9.30am to 1.00pm. Those who have no access to the online registration can telephone and book in for Mass with Jacinta.

**We are all in a new way of attending Mass to ensure the safety of everyone coming to Mass.
We will continue to keep you informed as and when the regulations change.
The most important thing is that everyone feels safe.**

## ST ELISABETH CONVENT

The Sisters of Saint Elisabeth Convent have now entered the Christmas season with the Nativity Fast. They are also preparing for some joyous December feast days, such as December 10th which is a very special day for the Convent for three reasons: First, on December 10th, 1999, **the first church on the Convent grounds was consecrated**. It is the crypt church in honor of St Nicholas the Wonderworker, which was built in one year. It marked the beginning of Saint Elisabeth Convent as we know it today. Second, in the evening of the same day, **two of our Sisters were tonsured to the Stavrophore**. One of them was our Mother Abbess Euphrosine. It was the very first Stavrophore monastic tonsure at our Convent. Last, on December 10, **the Orthodox Church commemorates the icon of the Mother of God called our Lady of the Sign (or Znamenie)**. ### INITIAL PLANS FOR 4 CORNERS FESTIVAL 2021

Professor John Paul Lederach, the internationally renowned conflict transformation expert, of Notre Dame University, USA, is the keynote speaker at the 9<sup>th</sup> annual **4 Corners Festival** that takes place in Belfast from **January 31 to February 7**. Due to the pandemic most of those attending the Christian arts festival that offers a rich mix of talks, music, drama, and prayer will do so from the comfort of their homes as the events will be streamed on-line having been promoted on social media.

The organising committee announced on the festival's website [www.4cornersfestival.com](http://www.4cornersfestival.com) that the theme is Breathe... from the Hebrew word Ruach meaning 'breath' or 'spirit' – the meaning of life.

They added, in a letter to supporters: "The programme is designed to encourage the breathing of hope and creativity into our city and to foster resilience as we contend with the challenges of the pandemic." Others taking part will include singer-songwriter Duke Special, Jamaican-born poet and singer-songwriter Raquel McKee and the poet and theologian Pádraig Ó Tuama.

The full programme will be announced shortly on the website and it is planned that a limited number will be able to attend some of the events, regulations permitting.

## AID TO THE CHURCH IN NEED

### Evangelisation in Ethiopia

**CATHOLICISM IS GROWING EXTREMELY QUICKLY ON THE CONTINENT OF AFRICA. THIS IS PARTLY DOWN TO THE EFFORTS OF MISSIONARIES SUCH AS FATHER KENNETH IWUNNA. FATHER KENNETH MINISTERS TO A PARISH IN THE SOUTH OF ETHIOPIA. IN THE LAST FEW YEARS, 5,000 OUT OF THE 9,000 PEOPLE IN THIS PARISH HAVE ACCEPTED THE CATHOLIC FAITH.**

Ethiopia is a large and ethnically diverse country. The majority of Ethiopia's population are Christian (mostly members of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church), with there also being a substantial Muslim minority. **In addition to this there are ethnic groups in Ethiopia who still practice traditional tribal religions.** This is the case with the Borana people in the south of Ethiopia. The Borana people are a nomadic people, who travel across the land with their herds to eke out a living. For this reason, **Father Kenneth Iwunna (who is from Nigeria) has been on an evangelisation mission for the last eight years** to bring the Gospel message to the Borana people.

Father Kenneth Iwunna has seen a lot of success in running Holy Cross Parish in the town of Dhadim. **Approximately 9,000 people live within the parish boundaries. Of these, around 5,000 have accepted the Catholic Faith over the traditional tribal religion.** Many of these people are now catechumens preparing for baptism. It is almost certain that thousands more will convert to Catholicism in the coming years. The rapid conversion of so many people has raised certain problems. One issue is of couples who have been married prior to being baptised. **They need to be validly married in the eyes of the Church before they can receive Holy Communion.** Weddings, as many of us are aware of, can be very expensive. Wedding rings, clothes and celebratory meals are particularly expensive. **In order to help his parishioners with the costs of the weddings, Father Kenneth Iwunna has organised for joint wedding ceremonies.** This allows for several couples to be validly married at once and therefore be able to receive the Eucharist.

Young people have been very active in Father Kenneth Iwunna's parish. **Around 250 young people are active on a regular basis in the parish.** Father Kenneth has organised a spiritual programme and direction for the young people. This includes Bible study, choral singing, and retreats. **By engaging with the young people, it is hoped that Father Kenneth can secure the future of Holy Cross Parish.** Part of this engagement includes an annual three-day retreat to the neighbouring diocese. Father Kenneth explains that this is important for the development of the young people: **"Most of them have never been anywhere except their own village, so that for them it is an important experience to meet together with young people from other ethnic groups and share their ideas and experiences. These young people are growing in their faith and gaining a new experience of the Church.** These days are an advantage not only for themselves, but also benefit the whole community. For when the young people come back they relate their experiences in the church. And even the older people are very interested to hear about them."

**Aid to the Church in Need provides support to Fr. Kenneth and his parish in all these activities. This is just one of the many pastoral and evangelical projects that Aid to the Church in Need Supports around the world.**
