

OFFICIAL GUIDE OF COLUMBAN WAY IN ITALY

The Italian members of the European Association of the Way of St Columba are pleased to announce the release in bookshops from 3 March 2022 of the official guidebook of the Way of St Columba published by Terre di Mezzo Editore, by the authors Caterina Barbuscia and Valeria Beretta with the collaboration of the Associations of the Friends of San Colombano per l'Europa of San Colombano al Lambro, the Friends of San Colombano of Bobbio and the Friends of the Cammino di San Colombano of Vaprio d'Adda who act as points of reference and support along the entire route. It was a great work of synergy between the three associations and the 62 municipalities, the two regions and the Diocese of Piacenza-Bobbio, crossed by the route, and other public and private bodies.

330 kilometres on foot or by bicycle from the Swiss border to Bobbio. The route of the Cammino di San Colombano winds its way along 18 stages, from Villa di Chiavenna, along the Sentiero del Viandante to Lecco and Milan, where the final 8 stages begin, leading to the last abbey founded by Saint Colombano in Bobbio.

This is the last stretch, on Italian territory, of a European Cultural Itinerary of over 5,000 km that crosses another 7 countries and follows in the footsteps of a man who helped build Europe.

An additional stage from Bobbio to Coli leads to the cave of San Michele.

THE WAY OF SAINT COLOMBAN, EUROPEAN CULTURAL ITINERARY AND PILGRIMAGE ROUTE IN ITALY 330 KM FROM THE SWISS BORDER TO BOBBIO IN 18 STAGES.

The years around the turn of the second millennium were characterised by the rediscovery of St. Columbanus, which brought him up to date after 14 centuries. Starting from the town of San Colombano al Lambro, where the interest for a deeper knowledge has been rekindled and devotion has never waned, this desire for rediscovery has gradually spread to many other places touched by his passage and his work, through studies, research, publications and initiatives of all kinds that have highlighted the importance that this figure has had and continues to have for Europe.

A dense network of links that has been created between the various civil and religious realities inspired by Columbanus has given rise to ideas and projects in many sectors, but it is thanks above all to the associations of the Friends of St. Columbanus, active in the places of ancient Colombian memory, that we have the idea of re-proposing to today's Europeans the path that the Irish monk travelled on foot or by boat between the 6th and 7th centuries from his native Ireland to Bobbio. With the European Association of the Way of St. Columbanus, founded in 2014, the idea took shape and after 7 years has become reality.

The idea was to repurpose one of the oldest pilgrimage routes in Europe, which winds through eight countries (in order Ireland, Great Britain, France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Liechtenstein, Italy), traced by one of the most venerated figures of the Middle Ages, an exponent of the migratory monastic phenomenon, typical of Ireland, which played a fundamental role in the birth of Western civilisation and Europe itself. For the part of the itinerary that winds through Italian territory, thanks to the Associazione Amici del Cammino di San Colombano of Vaprio d'Adda (for the area north of Milan), the Associazione Amici di San Colombano per l'Europa of San Colombano al Lambro (across the southern Milanese plain), the Association of Friends of San Colombano di Bobbio with the GAL Ducato di Parma e Piacenza (for the Piacenza Apennine section), which has mapped and reported on this journey in 18 stages, 330 km long, which will take all those who wish to travel along it from the Alps to the regions furrowed by rivers and lakes, to then reach the modern metropolis and, across the Po Valley, enter the valleys of the Piacenza Apennines, reminiscent of glimpses of Ireland.

The research work started from the few localities identified by Jonah in the Vita Sancti Columbani and then identified other localities that were the result of research and studies carried out in later periods or deduced from documents that formed the basis of their history, or supported by centuries of tradition, or imprinted in geographical places by popular beliefs handed down to the present day. Alongside the route probably followed by Colombanus, it has been decided to follow, in some places, paths already identified later on the ancient Roman roads (as in the case of some stages of the Sentiero del Viandante or the recent Via dei Monaci).

The Way of St. Columbanus is one of those routes proposed to the walking public that refer to the figure of saints who were travellers and pilgrims, whose tomb became a traditional pilgrimage destination. Columbanus is unanimously recognised as one of the most famous pilgrims; he was one first and foremost in his deeds, having travelled more than 5000 km on foot, but no less so in his state of mind, his inner attitude. The 140 km stretch from Milan to the tomb of Saint Columbanus in Bobbio was structured in 8 stages on the model of the Way of St James, with credentials and the issuing of the testimonium. So those who walk the last few kilometres in this spirit will be able to recall the work of a great evangeliser who combined prayer with work and study, embodying the Irish vocation for pilgrimage understood as the definitive abandonment of one's land and one's people, which entails a voluntary exile in the name of faith and therefore the choice to live forever without a homeland, as strangers in one place, as they are always on the way to their true homeland which is not of this world.

In addition to the historical and religious reasons for this journey, there are also important attractions in terms of the environment, landscape, culture, music, crafts and food and wine, which are so varied even though they are concentrated in just two regions, Lombardy and Emilia Romagna.

The invitation to those embarking on this adventure is therefore to rediscover, through the varied beauty of nature in its many forms, that "common home" which Columbanus conceived as such from its very beginnings, and to walk through it with the same spirit in grateful memory of a man who made history, who has not been forgotten and who gives us the opportunity, with this experience, to become protagonists of the history of Europe today.





DESPITE THE INCREASING RISK OF REMAINING IN THE WARZONES IN UKRAINE,
RELIGIOUS COMMUNITIES HAVE STAYED BEHIND TO SERVE THE PEOPLE. By Maria Lozano

Among others, she is in close contact with **several orders of nuns** in the war area. "The sisters are **full of fear and anxiety**, but they also feel **upheld by prayer** and by a worldwide wave of solidarity," she reports.

Kaczmarek speaks movingly of a conversation with a nun from a convent in northern Ukraine. For security reasons neither the nun's

name, nor the location can be revealed, but media reports confirm there is fierce fighting in this town. Several times during the night the sisters have had to take refuge in the basement; they sleep therefore in their habits and veils, so that they can run out of their rooms at any time. At night the whole convent is kept in darkness, so as not to attract attacks.

Since the beginning of this conflict they have tried as far as possible to **carry on with their conventual life**. The mobile phone is, however, a constant companion when they are saying the office, reports Kaczmarek: "In this way they can always get an early warning when another attack starts."

Now, however, because of the fierce fighting even **their convent basement is no longer safe**. **Therefore, the nuns have recently started taking refuge at night in an air raid shelter**. Several bombs have already landed near the convent, killing a young family, reports Magda Kaczmarek. **"The sisters are now hosting three families in the convent, who were very fearful for their lives."**

For the nuns that is no new task. Long before the attack by Russian troops at the end of February many people came seeking their help, including families affected by the war which began in 2014. They provided spiritual care for the wounded and their families: a mission as important then as it is now. For the local population the nuns are a sign of hope and guidance. Many neighbours say: "We are staying as long as the sisters stay. When they go, we go too."



Despite the gloomy situation there are little glimmers of light. "The nuns receive news from all around the world that people are thinking of them and praying for them. The friends and neighbours of the convent also show the nuns great solidarity, although these people are themselves in great distress," reports ACN's Project Manager.

The nuns say that **the Psalms have become very real** to them, reports Kaczmarek. "**They ask for protection from the dangers of war, and the promise of God's presence gives them strength.**" One of the nuns says that she has never prayed the Rosary as much as now.

ACN helped to fund the building of this convent and for many years has been continually contributing to the living expenses of the nuns. They thank ACN for the solidarity and closeness. Alongside the material help, the foundation has called on contemplative orders around the world to pray for Ukraine. Amid the terrible fear and



fighting in the country, this is a form of support which does not go unnoticed, reports Kaczmarek after her conversations with the nuns: "They feel that they are a part of the Church and that many people are with them."

In response to the outbreak of war in Ukraine the international pontifical foundation Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) is sending an aid package of 1.3 million euros. According to a statement from the President of ACN, Dr Thomas Heine-Geldern, the money is for priests and religious, who are working across the country in parishes, with refugees, in orphanages and homes for the elderly.
