The proposed date for "discontinuance" was 31 August 2022, but this will be amended to August 2023. This is still only a proposal and a final decision by the Dept. of Education is unlikely to be given in 2022, but if you would object to this proposal, please take a moment to write to dps@education-ni.gov.uk before March 20th. St Anne's has been serving the communities of Donaghadee/Millisle/Groomsport for 90 years, and its closure would leave children in the Ards Peninsula with a 12- to 16-mile return trip each day to the nearest Catholic primary school. The school had a glowing ETI inspection report in 2018, is in a healthy financial position, and pupil numbers have steadily increased from 29 in 2011 to 59 in September 2022. 

OFFICIAL GUIDE OF COLUMBAN WAY IN ITALY

The Italian members of the European Association of the Way of St Columba are pleased to announce the release in bookshops from 3 March 2022 of the official guidebook of the Way of St Columba published by Terre di Mezzo Editore, by the authors Caterina Barbuscia and Valeria Beretta with the collaboration of the Associations of the Friends of San Colombano per l'Europa of San Colombano al Lambro, the Friends of San Colombano of Bobbio and the Friends of the Cammino di San Colombano of Vaprio d'Adda who act as points of reference and support along the entire route. It was a great work of synergy between the three associations and the 62 municipalities, the two regions and the Diocese of Piacenza-Bobbio, crossed by the route, and other public and private bodies.

330 kilometres on foot or by bicycle from the Swiss border to Bobbio. The route of the Cammino di San Colombano winds its way along 18 stages, from Villa di Chiavenna, along the Sentiero del Viandante to Lecco and Milan, where the final 8 stages begin, leading to the last abbey founded by Saint Colombano in Bobbio.

This is the last stretch, on Italian territory, of a European Cultural Itinerary of over 5,000 km that crosses another 7 countries and follows in the footsteps of a man who helped build Europe.

An additional stage from Bobbio to Coli leads to the cave of San Michele.

THE WAY OF SAINT COLOMBAN, EUROPEAN CULTURAL ITINERARY AND PILGRIMAGE ROUTE IN ITALY 330 KM FROM THE SWISS BORDER TO BOBBIO IN 18 STAGES.

The years around the turn of the second millennium were characterised by the rediscovery of St. Columbanus, which brought him up to date after 14 centuries. Starting from the town of San Colombano al Lambro, where the interest for a deeper knowledge has been rekindled and devotion has never waned, this desire for rediscovery has gradually spread to many other places touched by his passage and his work, through studies, research, publications and initiatives of all kinds that have highlighted the importance that this figure has had and continues to have for Europe.

A dense network of links that has been created between the various civil and religious realities inspired by Columbanus has given rise to ideas and projects in many sectors, but it is thanks above all to the associations of the Friends of St. Columbanus, active in the places of ancient Colombian memory, that we have the idea of re-proposing to today's Europeans the path that the Irish monk travelled on foot or by boat between the 6th and 7th centuries from his native Ireland to Bobbio. With the European Association of the Way of St. Columbanus, founded in 2014, the idea took shape and after 7 years has become reality.

The idea was to repurpose one of the oldest pilgrimage routes in Europe, which winds through eight countries (in order Ireland, Great Britain, France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Liechtenstein, Italy), traced by one of the most venerated figures of the Middle Ages, an exponent of the migratory monastic phenomenon, typical of Ireland, which played a fundamental role in the birth of Western civilisation and Europe itself. For the part of the itinerary that winds through Italian territory, thanks to the Associazione Amici del Cammino di San Colombano of Vaprio d'Adda (for the area north of Milan), the Associazione Amici di San Colombano per l'Europa of San Colombano al Lambro (across the southern Milanese plain), the Association of Friends of San Colombano di Bobbio with the GAL Ducato di Parma e Piacenza (for the Piacenza Apennine section), which has mapped and reported on this journey in 18 stages, 330 km long, which will take all those who wish to travel along it from the Alps to the regions furrowed by rivers and lakes, to then reach the modern metropolis and, across the Po Valley, enter the valleys of the Piacenza Apennines, reminiscent of glimpses of Ireland.

The research work started from the few localities identified by Jonah in the Vita Sancti Columbani and then identified other localities that were the result of research and studies carried out in later periods or deduced from documents that formed the basis of their history, or supported by centuries of tradition, or imprinted in geographical places by popular beliefs handed down to the present day. Alongside the route probably followed by Colombanus, it has been decided to follow, in some places, paths already identified later on the ancient Roman roads (as in the case of some stages of the Sentiero del Viandante or the recent Via dei Monaci).

The Way of St. Columbanus is one of those routes proposed to the walking public that refer to the figure of saints who were travellers and pilgrims, whose tomb became a traditional pilgrimage destination. Columbanus is unanimously recognised as one of the most famous pilgrims; he was one first and foremost in his deeds, having travelled more than 5000 km on foot, but no less so in his state of mind, his inner attitude. The 140 km stretch from Milan to the tomb of Saint Columbanus in Bobbio was structured in 8 stages on the model of the Way of St James, with credentials and the issuing of the testimonium. So those who walk the last few kilometres in this spirit will be able to recall the work of a great evangeliser who combined prayer with work and study, embodying the Irish vocation for pilgrimage understood as the definitive abandonment of one's land and one's people, which entails a voluntary exile in the name of faith and therefore the choice to live forever without a homeland, as strangers in one place, as they are always on the way to their true homeland which is not of this world.

In addition to the historical and religious reasons for this journey, there are also important attractions in terms of the environment, landscape, culture, music, crafts and food and wine, which are so varied even though they are concentrated in just two regions, Lombardy and Emilia Romagna.

The invitation to those embarking on this adventure is therefore to rediscover, through the varied beauty of nature in its many forms, that "common home" which Columbanus conceived as such from its very beginnings, and to walk through it with the same spirit in grateful memory of a man who made history, who has not been forgotten and who gives us the opportunity, with this experience, to become protagonists of the history of Europe today.

Papal envoy visits refugees at Catholic seminary in Lviv

Cardinal krajewski, a papal envoy to ukraine and pope francis' almoner, has paid a visit to refugees staying at a retreat house in a catholic seminary in lviv. The cardinal assured the refugees there that they were in the prayers of pope francis. By Tobias Lehner

"There is a lot of coming and going here. Thousands of refugees arrive every day," reports Father Wladyslaw Biszko in conversation with the international foundation Aid to the Church in Need (ACN). The priest leads a pilgrim and retreat

house in Lviv, on the same premises as the Roman Catholic seminary. Since the start of the war, the buildings, which were constructed largely through the support of ACN, have been used as a camp for refugees from all over Ukraine and last Wednesday was visited by the envoy of Pope Francis, the Polish Cardinal Konrad Krajewski.

The house is open to everyone seeking refuge, explains the priest. "We don't ask about religion. However, people should know that they are in a Catholic centre. We pray before meals and have devotions every evening, which are well received."

"About **120 people** live here all the time," reports Fr Biszko. "They are simply waiting to see whether they can go back to their houses." It's mostly a case of mothers with their children or elderly people who don't want to leave their homeland – at least not yet. **The people are sleeping in every space available, including on the ground in the conference rooms.**



The refugees do not just include Ukrainians. **Visiting international students, from India for example, are also seeking refuge.** Before the war, Lviv, Kyiv, Odessa and Kharkhov were popular with international students.

As the envoy of Pope Francis, **Cardinal Krajewski has been in Ukraine since Tuesday** and is seeking to strengthen the Church's relief work. "**The Holy Father is present in Ukraine**," he said during his visit, "although he is in the Vatican. He is suffering with you. The Pope is experiencing the way of the Cross which you in Ukraine are walking."

The Cardinal, who as **the Pope's almoner is responsible for distributing charity in his name**, highlighted the fact that after the beginning of the war Pope Francis visited the Russian ambassador to the Holy See to appeal for "compassion and peace". Normally it is the Pope who summons ambassadors. **The pontiff is advocating for peace** "**in every imaginable way," said Cardinal Krajewski.** "At the same time the Pope is grateful to everyone who is showing their love towards Ukraine."

In response to the outbreak of war in Ukraine, **Aid to the Church in Need is sending an aid package which currently amounts to 1.3 million euros.** The money is for priests and religious, who are working across the country in parishes, with refugees, in orphanages and homes for the elderly. The foundation is also appealing for prayers for peace in Ukraine.
