

The Columban Way starts in Co Carlow on a 1,400 foot high saddle between Mount Leinster and Slieve Bawn in the Blackstairs Mountains. The starting point is marked by a Cairn modelled on a beehive cell similar to those which still stand on the exposed peak of Skellig Michael far out in the Atlantic. There is a large monastic bell set into the monument similar in form to the smaller bells Columbanus and other journeying monks would have carried to summon the faithful and act as a focal point for the new churches they founded on their extensive travels.





The Way was officially launched on the 19th February 2022 on a fine, bright breezy day sandwiched between the passing of Storms Eunice and Franklin. After the official launch at the Columbanus Cairn, a large group of about 70 walkers of all ages and abilities set off gently downhill along a single track road which hugged the mountain slopes giving great views west over County Carlow. The route was extremely well waymarked with a combination of brown tourist finger posts, granite stone pillars and

recycled resin waymark posts. The first section runs 6 miles along quiet public roads to the attractive village of Myshall which is also rich in Columban connection and ecclesiastical history. Apart from one short section the route was all downhill losing around 1000 feet along the way, with mountain scenery giving way to commercial forestry and then farmland and country lanes.



At Myshall community hall soup and sandwiches were provided for the walkers, and old friends and new were able to relax and discuss future outings along the Columban Way. Charlie and Rachel Reid



Bibles and Catechisms for Young Venezuelan Catholics

For several years now, Venezuela has been going through a crisis almost without parallel – a crisis only further exacerbated by the pandemic. Nearly 80% of the country's approximately 33 million citizens suffer extreme poverty, and many live in hunger. There is a dire lack of basic necessities, including water, electricity and fuel, making life almost impossible in many regions of the country. On top of this, there is galloping inflation. Some people survive only thanks to support from relatives abroad. In contrast, others find themselves forced to turn to illegal



activities — which in turn has led to a widespread increase in organised crime and drug trafficking. Meanwhile, at least 5 million Venezuelans have simply left the country.

Today, the Catholic Church is almost the only body in Venezuela that is still standing resolutely by its suffering people. Not only by providing practical support, wherever possible, but also – conscious of the need to bring hope to struggling souls and above all to the young – by helping to prepare them, from a perspective of Christian faith, so that they can work for a better future for their country. For there are many people who have a deep hunger for the Word of God.

Bishop Juan Carlos Bravo Salazar of the Diocese of Acarigua-Araure wanted to be able to equip the young people in his diocese with the necessary tools to be able to grow in their faith, from a solid moral and spiritual foundation, and find the strength in their relationship with God to be able to help shape the future of their country. To this end, he asked ACN to send him 2000 copies of the Bible and 496 copies of the Youth Bible. He also asked for 480 copies of YOUCAT, the youth catechism

based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church that is designed for young people and young adults, which presents the most important fundamentals of the Catholic faith in a simple and easy-to-understand question-and-answer style. His aim was to deepen and intensify the catechetical outreach in the parishes — with additional online facilities available especially during the time of the pandemic.

Thanks to the generosity of our benefactors, we were able to provide the necessary €15,546 to fund the project and meet the bishop's request. As it happens, Bishop Bravo Salazar was recently appointed to another diocese, but he has nonetheless written to thank us: "Thanks to the Bibles and the YOUCAT, we have been able to begin a marvellous task. We would like to thank you once again for the help you have given us in providing the faithful with a better religious instruction, since we are all called to help build up the Church of Christ. We give thanks to God for the goodness He has shown through each and every one of you and we pray that He may bless you all abundantly."
