Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of ALL SOULS. From twelve O'clock noon on 1 November until midnight on 2 November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the pope's intentions (One Our Father, One Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confessions may be made anytime within the week preceding or the week following 1 November.

The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1 to 8 November. (For conditions see above).

Indulgences are granted through the ministry of the Church. See Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC, 1471-9, 1498) for a fuller explanation.



Pope endorses ACN Rosary campaign

"ONE MILLION CHILDREN PRAYING THE ROSARY" TAKES PLACE ON 18 OCTOBER. POPE FRANCIS ASKS THAT PARTICIPANTS ESPECIALLY REMEMBER ALL COUNTRIES THAT SUFFER FROM WAR AND MISERY.

Pope Francis said: "On **18 October**, the foundation Aid to the Church in Need is promoting the event 'One million children praying the Rosary',

for peace in the world. To all

the boys and girls who will be participating, thank you!"

The origins of the prayer initiative "A million children praying the Rosary" date back to the year 2005 when a group of children were praying the Rosary at a local shrine in the Venezuelan capital Caracas, and the adults who witnessed the scene were reminded of the words of Padre Pio: "When a million children pray the Rosary, the world will change." Since then, the campaign has spread rapidly and become a worldwide phenomenon.



This year, *Aid to the Church in Need* is once again inviting parishes, kindergartens, schools and families to join in the annual prayer initiative "*One million children praying the Rosary*". The purpose of this prayer



campaign is to ask for peace and unity throughout the world, while encouraging children and young people to trust in God during difficult times, according to the international president of ACN, Cardinal Mauro Piacenza.

"Looking around at all the wars and wickedness, the persecution, disease and fears that weigh upon our world, people might well ask, 'Is God really in control?", writes Cardinal Piacenza, in his

text inviting people to participate in the initiative.

"Yes, He is", Cardinal Piacenza responds, "but we must also reach out for His outstretched hands and cling to Him. God has reached out to us, through Mary (...). We believe that if we faithfully recite the Rosary together, then the holy Mother of God will lead us all as one great family into the loving arms of our heavenly Father".

The ACN **webpage offers free materials** for those praying in parishes, schools, children's groups and families. The free information pack contains instructions on how to pray the Rosary, short meditations for children on the Mysteries of the Rosary and an Act of Consecration to Our Lady for children.

RCIA is a time of teaching, formation and conversion to come to know, love and develop a relationship with God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

How do I sign up for RCIA?

The first step is to request a conversation with Fr Gunn PP T:028 9146 5522. We are facilitating one to one meetings on RCIA with the help of Sr Maura Gallahue in Bangor Parish.

When and where does RCIA meet together in the Diocese?

We meet Thursday nights from 6.30 - 8.00 pm at St Mary's Hall, Chapel Lane, Belfast BT1 1HH from October to May. The start date for the programme is Thursday 6th October 2022. For registration form: E: rcia@downandconnor.org

What is the format of the sessions?

The sessions begin with prayer, followed by teaching, question and answer and small group discussion and concludes with prayer.

What is the cost for attending RCIA?

There is a minimal cost to you to attend RCIA. Resources are provided by the diocese.

May I bring my spouse/fiancé to the sessions?

Yes, you may. We encourage your spouse/fiancé to attend the sessions with you.

If I have been baptized in another church, do I need to be baptised again?

In most cases, you do not need to be baptised again. The Catholic Church requires that you were baptised with water, in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We will need a copy of your baptismal certificate or other proof of baptism from the church where you were baptised. Proof of baptism may include a letter from the church, a copy of the membership record indicating that you were baptised, etc.

I was told I need a sponsor who is a baptised and confirmed Catholic, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church. What if I don't know anyone who could do that?

Don't worry about it. We have people who volunteer to fulfil the sponsor role.

Do I have to attend every session?

Our desire is to have you attend all sessions. RCIA is certainly a place where you will learn about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches; however, it is much more than that. It is a process of getting to know Jesus Christ and growing together in community. RCIA is a process of conversion to a life with Christ. This process takes time and commitment on your part.

How many sessions can I miss?

RCIA is a building-block process and each session builds on the one before. However, we realise that there may be situations which would cause someone to be unable to attend. Therefore, absences are handled on a case-by-case basis. If you must miss a session, arrangements can be made to provide you with a copy of the notes from that session.

Can a Catholic attend to learn more about their faith?

Yes, we have had many people do this in the past and would love to have you join us to learn more about your Catholic faith!
