UPDATE ON INVESTIGATION WORK AT MOST HOLY REDEEMER CHURCH, BALLYHOLME

A Condition Report on the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer has been received and discussed in depth by the Parish Finance Committee.

Several examinations remain to be carried out, including a hammer test to discover the true state of internal and external plasterwork but preliminary work to weather proof the building will be undertaken as soon as possible.

The reports on the roof, the electrical system and the need for a new boiler call for considerable expenditure.

With the parish having suffered a 30% drop in income and finding itself in deficit the problem of how to finance the necessary repairs to MHR and the other parochial properties is very difficult to solve. The full extent of the financial difficulties of the parish will be detailed in the annual financial report which is being prepared for distribution to parishioners in the near future.

In the meantime, if you have not collected your parish envelopes for this year please contact the parish office. Use of these envelopes will allow the parish to collect valuable Gift Aid.

Everyone is experiencing financial worries at this time so I know that you will understand the parish's need to maximise income and to make any economies necessary.

When more detailed information is available it shall be communicated to parishioners.

As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to religious life or to live as generous single people. **Sunday 8th May 2022** is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The Lord asked his disciples to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Pray also for the priests who have ministered to you throughout your life, both living and dead. Encourage your children, grandchildren, or other young people to consider a vocation as a priest or religious brother or sister.

Columbanus Book Launch (Columbanus and Identity in Early Medieval Europe: Formation and Transition) Saturday 14 May 2022 1.30pm - 3.30pm St Comgall's Primary School, Brunswick Road, Bangor

Background

The 1400th anniversary of the death of Columbanus, the renowned leader in the spread of Christianity across Europe, was widely celebrated in the three principal centres of his monastic foundations: Bangor in Northern Ireland, Luxeuil-les Bain in France, and Bobbio in Italy. These three centres were chosen by the Committee Scientifique de l'Europe for the launch of a major educational project: organising three academic conferences involving academics from across Europe who were invited to deliver papers on their research related to the work and influence of Columbanus.

The overall brief 'Making Europe: Columbanus and his Legacy' was launched at the initial meeting held in University College Galway in Ireland in March 2010. Research was commissioned and the sites at Annagry (France) and Cleenish (Co Fermanagh) were excavated and examined. Each conference had its own outputs and research and three volumes, one representing each conference, are now published.

The book will be presented by **Conor Newman**, senior lecturer in the Department of Archaeology, NUI Galway, who will talk about the project, from inception to publication, alongside some of the discoveries and achievements. Four French colleagues who were involved in this project will also be travelling to Bangor to attend this event.

Supporting sick and retired priests

WORK BEGINS ON A RESIDENTIAL HOME FOR SICK AND RETIRED PRIESTS IN THE DIOCESE OF JAGDALPUR, INDIA.

stone of a future clergy house. (Credit: Aid to the Church in Need) There are 110 priests actively working in the Diocese of Jagdalpur in the state of Chhattisgarh, central-eastern India. Their work is hard and demands great self-sacrifice, for their ministry is in remote and underdeveloped regions and involves travelling long and difficult journeys. The diocese covers an area of around 15,000 square miles (39,000 km²), an area almost the size of the Netherlands or Switzerland. Of the 2.9 million or so inhabitants of the region, only a little over 11,000 are Catholics. The majority of the

population belong to ethnic minorities.

The diocese was established in 1972, and the first priests came here from other regions of India. They belonged to
the Syro-Malabar congregation of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate. **Since 1990 there have also been a number of local vocations. At present, there are 15 young men in the major seminary and another 18 in**

the minor seminary. They have been inspired by the example of other priests, whom they have witnessed at work since childhood. "People wonder why the priests leave their families and their home regions. They can see that the priests are not looking for any professional advancement but are simply there among them to serve", explains Father Tijo Manjamakkil. The priests go out and proclaim the Good News of the Gospel to the poor and the marginalised, sharing their hard lives with them and striving to help them, little by little, to improve their lives by being in the words of Saint Paul "all things to all men" (1 Corinthians 9:22).




Many of these priests, who for many long years have carried the life of the Church in the region on their shoulders, are now old and frail, or sick and worn out by the harsh lives they have endured. They can no longer struggle on in these remote villages but require medical care and assistance. So now **the diocese is building the Shalom retirement home for ailing and retired priests where, after decades of faithful service, they themselves will now be able to receive the help and care they need.**

Thanks to the generosity of our benefactors, we have been able to contribute €30,000 towards the cost of this project – and now the foundation stone has finally been laid and the building work begun. To all of you who have helped, our heartfelt thanks!
